the QES system. QES has been commissioned by the JPBU to deliver an IT case management solution for SARs and CSPRs.

Moving to the QES system will be more efficient, reducing email distribution of forms, version control of templates, compilation of timelines and reduced administration on subsequent panel meetings, giving one central location for all referrals. The QES system will enable organisations to see

their own referrals, progress and actions.

National News

"What Good Looks Like" Assurance Preparation Resource Pack: The Northern ADASS regions have collaborated to produce this CQC assessment preparation resource. It focusses on the northern context and supports Local Authorities in the north to frame their ASC improvement journey across the 4 CQC themes.

National Child Mortality Database Programme Thematic Report quantifies the number of sudden unexpected deaths of infants and children in England. The findings and learnings from this report will inform policies and interventions required to reduce the number of children who die.

No Wrong Door Report by the Mental Health Foundation and NHS Confederation outlines a basis for changes to mental health, autism and learning disability services, raising the need for better-resources community based support, earlier intervention, and a well trained workforce available to meet people's needs practically and emotionally.

<u>Safeguarding Adults Review on Whorlton Hall</u> was published in December 2022 by Durham Safeguarding Partnership. The review was triggered by a BBC Panorama Programme on 22nd May 2019 which alleged psychological and physical abuse of people living at Whorlton Hall, an independent hospital in Barnard Castle, by people who should have been caring for them. Findings included:

- Lack of standards or expertise requirements for provider-led safeguarding investigations of cultures.
- There was an illusion of advocacy provision for people with learning disabilities, and/or who are
- autistic, and who are inpatients or at risk of being admitted to specialist hospitals,
- A need for closer working between CQC and LA to improve outcomes from organisational
- safeguarding enquiries in specialist hospitals.
