National News

<u>Neglect: learning from case reviews</u> has been published by the NSPCC, summarising the risk factors and learning for improved practice around neglect.

<u>Care and support and homelessness: Top tips on the role of adult social care</u> has been developed as part of the Local Government Authority (LGA) and Directors of Adult Social Services (ADASS) work with the Shared Outcomes Fund. It seeks to support directors of adult social services and their teams, focusing on the role of social care in supporting people experiencing and recovering from homelessness.

Child Delta: Brighton and Hove Safeguarding Children Partnership (BHSCP) commissioned this Local Child Safeguarding Practice Review (LCSPR) following the tragic death of a 20-month-old girl in December 2019. The post-mortem found that her death was caused by a combination of starvation ketoacidosis1 and influenza. Her mother pleaded guilty to a charge of manslaughter and was subsequently sentenced to a substantial prison term in 2021. The death occurred when the mother left her young daughter alone in their flat for 6 days, whilst she was with friends in London and elsewhere in England.

Oversight of out-of-school settings: lessons learnt from the DfE funded pilot : Lessons learnt from a DfE funded pilot which examined the existing oversight of out-of-school settings.

Serious Violence Duty: Preventing and reducing serious violence. Statutory Guidance for responsible Authorities has been published by the Home Office.

The first ever SUDC UK Parliamentary Debate took place on Tuesday 17th January 2023 at 4.30pm in Westminster Hall, applied for by Kwasi Kwarteng MP and Dr Ben Spencer MP. The Lancashire SUDC team is referenced in the speech and Jo Birch, SUDC Nurse, mentioned by name.

Build and Talk : The NSPCC has teamed up with the Lego group to help promote their Build and Talk online safety resources so that parents and caregivers fee empowered to start relaxed and playful conversations about digital safety and wellbeing.
